The following is transcribed from Alice Duer Miller's sarcastic column. It emphasized the importance of their movement by illustrating the lack of fairness in the anti-suffrage movement. It was published as a poster by the National Women Suffrage Association.

- 1. Because man's place is the army.
- 2. Because no really manly man wants to settle any question otherwise than by fighting about it.
- 3. Because if men should adopt peaceable methods women will no longer look up to them.
- 4. Because men will lose their charm if they step out of their natural sphere and interest themselves in other matters than feats of arms, uniforms and drums.
- 5. Because men are too emotional to vote. Their conduct at baseball games and political conventions shows this, while their innate [2] tendency to appeal to force renders them peculiarly unfit for the task of government.


