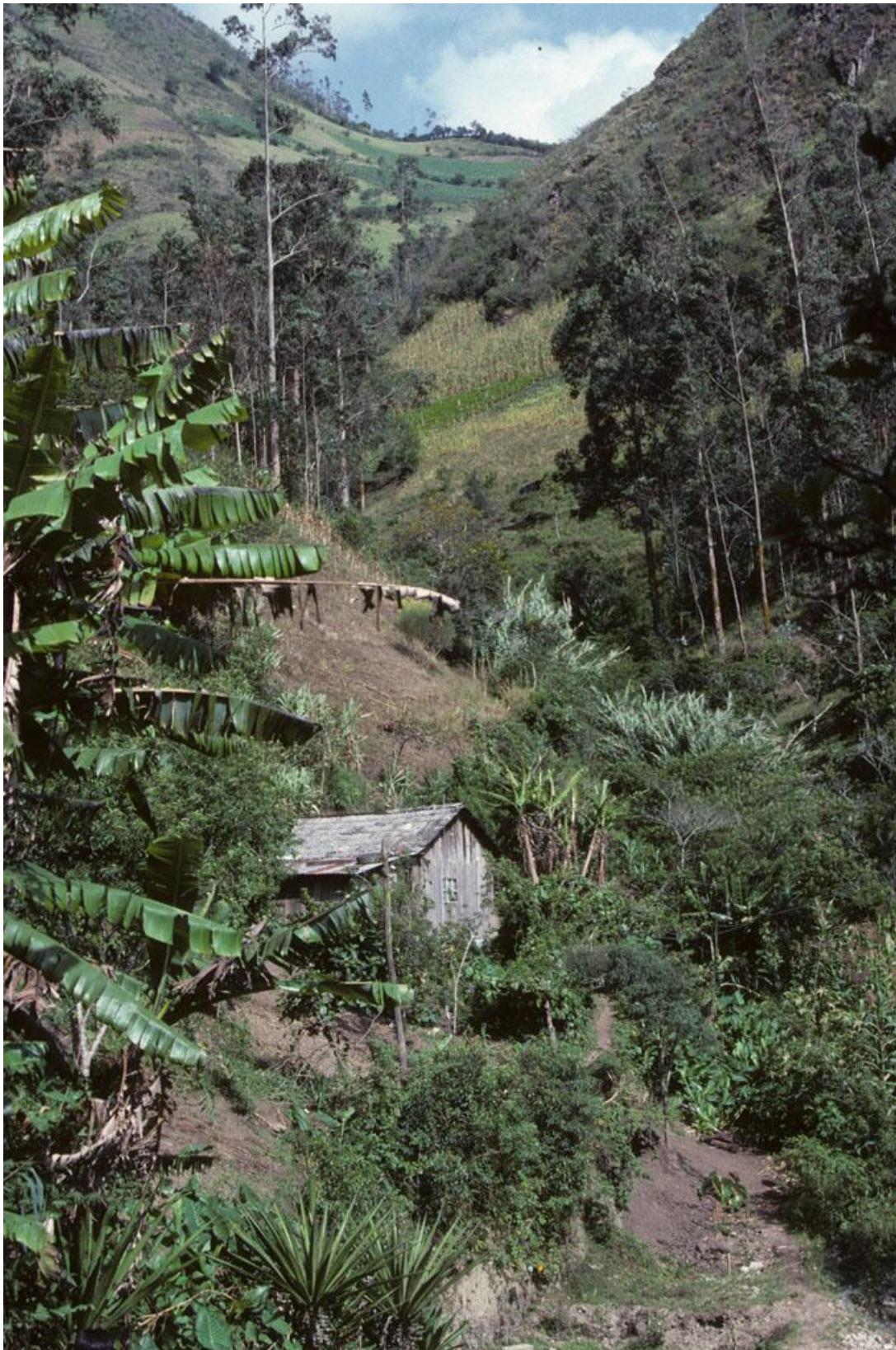


A hut in the hills above Banos
