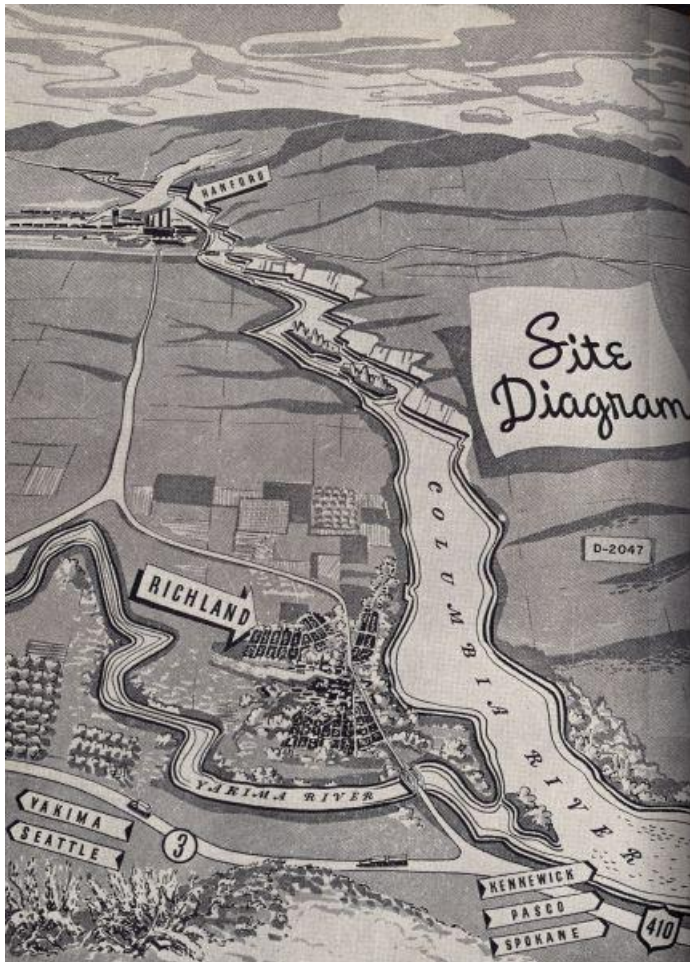


Diagram of Hanford, Washington
