The volcano has erupted several times in the past 500 years. Most notably, an eruption hastily ended a battle between Incas and Spaniards in 1534. It has been dormant for the last 35 years, though today steam can be seen emanating from its crater. Ecuador is known for a string of active volcanoes, making the country part of the Pacific "ring of fire."
