
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Nonfiction writing assignments can take a variety of forms. The papers included news reports, opinion and editorial pieces, and images. This assignment required students to translate a historical account into a contemporary one, to grasp the conventions of newspaper writing, and to demonstrate an understanding of the difference between fact and opinion.



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
