
### Young boy in Banos, Ecuador

A major attraction of this region is the 16,479 ft. volcano peak of Tungurahua. Tungurahua, or Black Giant, is an active volcano that spewed ash and rocks for several months in 2003. Banos is located near the eastern rainforest of Ecuador making it a likely place to encounter Andean Indians.
