

Women and men musicians accompany a water puppet performance in Hanoi

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Women and men musicians play traditional instruments, including drums and flute, at a water puppet performance in Hanoi. Vietnam's unique water puppet tradition is said to date back approximately 1,000 years. Early northern Vietnamese farmers created these dramas using wooden puppets that they operated from poles moving unseen below the water surface in their wet-rice fields. The puppets carved from jackfruit wood, which were traditionally up to several feet tall, are fastened to bamboo poles manipulated by puppeteers standing in water behind a screen. The puppet performances, now accompanied by musicians in colorful traditional-style clothes and hats, include two-hour comic dramas about farmers' lives and Vietnamese historical events.



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
