5-9 (yellow-green)

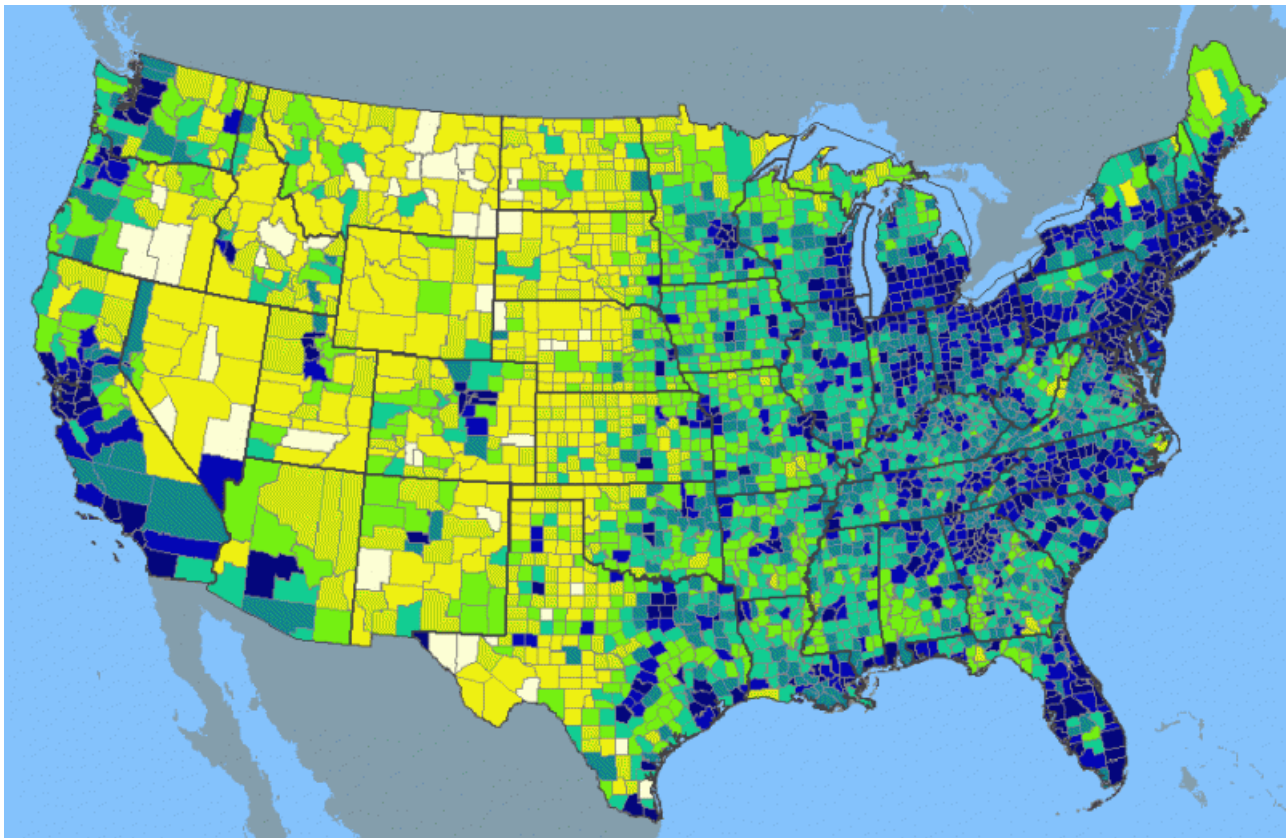
10-24 (green)
