Library. Seeking a name for his manufactured smoking tobacco shortly after the <u>Civil War [10]</u>, John R. Green of <u>Durham [11]</u> drew inspiration from a popular brand of mustard made in Durham, England, that featured the head of a Durham bull on its label. Green chose to use the image of a whole bull, and his trademark-soon the subject of extensive litigation to protect it-became one of the most recognizable product advertisements in the country. Green made <u>William T. Blackwell [12]</u> his partner in 1867, and when Green died two years later, Blackwell bought the entire business from the Green estate. Subsequently, with James R. Day and <u>Julian S. Carr [13]</u> as his partners, Blackwell led the William T. Blackwell Company to a dominant position in Durham's burgeoning tobacco industry. Bull Durham smoking tobacco was widely advertised and was one of the world's best-known American products of the late nineteenth and early twentieth centuries. The 1988 blockbuster film <u>Bull Durham [14]</u>, starring <u>Kevin Costner [15]</u>, <u>Susan Sarandon [16]</u>, and <u>Tim Robbins [17]</u>, brought national attention to both the famous tobacco moniker and the <u>Durham Bulls [18]</u>, Durham's popular minor league baseball team.
