The <u>Concessions and Agreement [8]</u> was a document issued by the Lords Proprietors [4] of Carolina on 7 Jan. 1665 to a group of Barbadian planters represented by Maj. William Yeamans [9]. Although the Barbadians intended to settle in the <u>Cape Fear</u> (a region, the <u>Concessions</u> and <u>Agreement</u> applied to Carolina in its entry. As such, it was Carolina's first written constitution. The Concessions and Agreement also provided for a method of land distribution and guaranteed settlers freedom of conscience in religion.

From the existing records, it appears that some aspects of the Concessions and Agreement were operative by mid-1665. The document remained in effect until early 1672, when it was superseded by the Fundamental Constitutions of Carolina [2].
