grape (*Vitis labrusca*) thrives in North Carolina's <u>piedmont</u> [5] and <u>mountain</u> [6] regions. One variety of fox grape, the Catawba, was apparently first found along the banks of Cane Creek south of Swannanoa in <u>Buncombe County</u> [7]. Catawba wine also became a popular antebellum spirit well outside the South, fortifying <u>Harriet Beecher Stowe</u> [8] in her
