

Mandatory Busing, Charlotte (1973)

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Two African American children and more than thirty white children riding in a school bus from the suburbs to an inner city school, Charlotte, North Carolina (1973). The Supreme Court decided in 1971 that busing was a good method to achieve school desegregation. It wasn't until July 1975 that the courts were satisfied that adequate progress had been made with school desegregation.
