The <u>Odd Fellows Home and School for the Orphaned Children of North Carolina</u><sup>[3]</sup> was built on East Ash Street at the corner of Herman Street in Goldsboro by the Grand <u>Lodge of the North Carolina</u> Odd Fellows<sup>[4]</sup>. It was located on a 20-acre tract of land donated in 1891 by W. A. Peacock, a member of the local <u>Odd Fellows lodge</u><sup>[4]</sup>, and his wife, Hattie. The first child was admitted to the home on 9 May 1892. The home provided for 960 children before closing in 1971. The property was sold to the city of Goldsboro in the late 1970s and became part of a city park. The <u>Wayne County Public</u> <u>Library</u><sup>[5]</sup> was built on a portion of the land.
