The Warren Junto was the nickname of a group of politicians, led by [Nathaniel Macon](#) <sup>[3]</sup> and all having some connection to [Warren County](#) <sup>[4]</sup>, who were instrumental in the growth of the [Jeffersonian Republican Party](#) <sup>[5]</sup> in North Carolina during early statehood. As [President Thomas Jefferson](#) <sup>[6]</sup>'s chief lieutenant in North Carolina, Macon, with his group, contributed greatly to Jefferson's success in the state in the 1800 presidential election. The [Raleigh Register](#) <sup>[7]</sup>, the party's official organ, also played a significant role.
