1791). 198. [2]Robert Ferguson, printer, operated a <u>printing press</u> [3] next to the courthouse in Hillsborough from 1785 to 1792. There he printed the <u>North Carolina Gazette</u> [4] in 1785 and 1786 and perhaps even longer, as well as the journal of the <u>Constitutional Convention of 1788</u> [5]. In the latter year and at other times he may also have printed for the state. On the 1790 Hillsborough tax list he is record as owning two town lots, a 150-acre farm, and as the enslaver of one person. In 1791, Governor <u>William Blount</u> [6] of the Southwest Territory engaged the services of Ferguson and <u>George Roulstone</u> [7], editor of the *Fayetteville Gazette*, to establish a printing press beyond the mountains. Some time that year they began printing the <u>Knoxville</u> (Tenn.) <u>Gazette</u> [8] in Rogersville. Ferguson and Roulstone moved to the new town of Knoxville about seven months after it had been established. Ferguson retired with the issue of 4 May 1793, and no further record of his life has been found.
