John Hogg, legislator, arrived in Wilmington [2] from Anstruther, Fife, Scotland, about 1797. He, it is assumed, was a cousin of Robert [3], John [4], and James Hogg [5] of the mercantile house of Hogg and Campbell—with branches in Wilmington, Cross Creek, Hillsborough, and elsewhere—and a member of that firm. Hogg was elected to the legislature from Hillsborough in 1794 and 1796. In 1809 he contributed \$25 to the building fund for the Main or South Building at The University of North Carolina [6]. He died in Fayetteville.
